How will my child's progress be assessed?

- Teachers' regular marking of your child's books. Comments and targets set by teachers will guide your child to make progress in their learning
- Throughout the year, your child will complete tests and assessments to consolidate subject knowledge and prepare your child for their final GCSE examination at the end of Year 11
- Mid-course examinations will take place during the summer term (these are internal exams and will inform you about the progress your child is making in their GCSE subjects)

When will my child's progress be assessed?

Autumn Term:

- You will receive a progress update that will inform you of the progress your child is making in all their subjects

Spring Term:

- Parents' Evening takes place during this term and it is an opportunity for you and your child to meet with your child's subject teachers

Summer Term:

- During this term, you will receive a formal report, which will inform you of the progress your child is making in their GCSE subjects
- At the end of the summer term, you will receive a copy of your child's mid-course examination results

- Maths 1 x 90 minutes
- MFL 1 X 60 minutes
- Triple Science 3 x 45 minutes
- Option Subject 1 x 45 minutes
- These guidelines represent a minimum amount of homework for Year 10
