- Mock examinations take place during the spring term

## When will my child's progress be assessed?

### Autumn Term:

- You will receive a progress update that will inform you of the progress your child is making in all their subjects

### Spring Term:

- During this term, you will receive a formal report, which will inform you of the progress your child is making in their GCSE subjects
- You will receive a copy of your child's mock examination results
- Parents' Evening takes place in during this term and it is an opportunity for you and your child to meet with your child's subject teachers to discuss progress being made towards their GCSE examinations
