Dear Parents/Carers

Thank you for your interest in Weatherhead High School. This prospectus will give you some information about the school and supports our culture that the learning and the well-being of our students is at the centre of everything we do. The school is an extremely popular and successful 11-18 girls' comprehensive school with nearly 1,600 students on roll including a mixed Sixth Form of approximately 320 students. # Pastoral Student Support

Many of our new intake students are already familiar with Weatherhead as a consequence of our outreach work with local primary schools. We organise induction days and curriculum visits to ensure students are given confidence and start learning as soon as they arrive. Senior students help Year 7 settle in and find their way around the building. Parents are kept fully informed of progress and we also ensure that there is a Parents' Evening in October of the first term to give an opportunity to discuss any issues of concern. Parents are encouraged to contact the school at any time if they need clarification or if they are concerned about their child. Also, we provide the opportunity for drop-in sessions where parents are able, without appointment, to visit and discuss issues of concern with the Headteacher. The dates for these are well publicised in advance on our website.

Happy students are successful students and we work really hard to ensure that we develop positive relationships, rewarding students for their effort and commitment to their studies through our specialist reward system. Every student has a Form Tutor and wherever possible that Form Tutor remains with the student for five years until the end of Year 11. There is a culture in the School where everyone is valued and respected. We ensure that student self-esteem and self-confidence is encouraged to develop so as to provide the best possible chance for a mature, informed and healthy life. A Pastoral Student Services Team has a team of professionals all dedicated to providing the best for Weatherhead students. We have a part-time School Nurse based at Weatherhead and there are other extended service healthcare professionals visiting the school on a weekly basis providing healthcare needs. The quality of our work in supporting students has been recognised by Ofsted and by the numerous awards of excellence presented to the School.



# Weatherhead Sixth Form

We offer a broad, balanced curriculum where students study core and foundation subjects in Years 7-9: English, Maths, Science, Technology, History, Geography, Music, Art, Computing, PE, Spanish and Religious Studies. We enrich the curriculum with many other opportunities, for example, Latin is taken by some Year 7 students as part of an extra-curricular programme. Also, Dance, Drama, Media and Music are introduced into the curriculum. From the outset emphasis is placed on high academic standards for which the school is very well known. Members of staff are alert to new developments in course content and teaching methods and we ensure that students develop skills that will help them throughout their life. Leadership opportunities are provided through many routes; Form Captains, Lunch Leaders, Charity or School Council Reps, Curriculum Ambassadors and the Duke of Edinburgh Awards. All students are encouraged to develop good study habits and are taught how to learn effectively. Homework forms an integral part of the courses offered at all levels at the school. Homework planners are provided for every student and parents are encouraged to support students and their learning by discussing their homework with them and signing the planner on a weekly basis. Any concerns can be highlighted in the planner and Form Tutors and subject staff regularly contact parents to clarify issues and support students.

Weatherhead Sixth Form is an increasingly popular and successful sixth form with a community of over 320 students, studying a combination of over 35 academic and vocational courses. A Levels are offered in almost all disciplines and there are also a range of vocational courses on offer.

In the future, almost all Year 7 students will continue their studies into the Sixth Form. Weatherhead students have first priority in application for places at Post-16 level. The Sixth Form offers high quality teaching from committed teachers, we also provide outstanding pastoral support. Excellent extra-curricular opportunities, specialist careers advice, and a variety of enrichment and leadership opportunities ensure continuous social and personal development. The Sixth Form Scholars' Programme prepares gifted students for applications to top universities through the fortnightly debating club, visits to Oxford and Cambridge and mock interviews. Our specialist Sixth Form staff ensure that every student has the opportunity to achieve their full potential.

We take pride in all our students' progression routes. All students attend two school led university trips. Last year over 120 students were successful in their applications to university, many at Russell Group universities, to study a wide range of courses, including: Business & Marketing, Chemistry, Criminology, Fashion, Genetics, History, Maths, Nursing, Physics, Politics, Primary Education and Sport.
