

Science Masterclass

Primary students from local schools attended Weatherhead's Saturday Science Masterclass, as part of the KS2 Gifted Gateway Programme. The event introduced them to the three sciences at secondary level - Physics, Biology, Chemistry.

In the Biology session, students looked at dissection and learning about the function and location of the different organs of the body, including the heart. Flame tests gave pupils an opportunity to learn about combustion and different chemical reactions. Circuit making and electrostatics was a real fascination for many as they created electrical circuits.

Quizzes and prizes wrapped up the event as students shared their findings and morning's activities with parents.

Park Primary Pupils Get with the Programme

Our ICT department hosted a group of 22 excited Year 5 pupils from Park Primary School for a morning of programming skills. The pupils used tiny computers called *Raspberry Pi*'s, to build a traffic light system that functioned using *Scratch* code to operate the lighting sequences. They designed the programming code to switch the lights on/off and build in suitable delays as in a real traffic light system. Once the task was completed, the pupils designed their own disco lighting model and built their own sequences to operate the lights as required. Pupils also used *Scratch* to develop a 70's style *Ping Pong* game that allowed two players to compete against each other and against the clock. The group really enjoyed the morning and developed key skills for computer programming and writing code, as well as developing their independent learning and teamwork.



"Buen Provecho!" – Spanish Taster Session



Our Spanish department laid on a fun filled afternoon of activities for the Greenleas Primary School pupils who enjoyed a series of Spanish taster sessions run by Head of Spanish, Miss Ryan. Greenleas pupils enjoyed singing and dancing to Spanish music, played lingo bingo and tasted authentic Spanish food, which they were able to order using their language skills from camarero (Spanish waiter) Mr Williams! The group showed real aptitude and enthusiasm for languages and really enjoyed the experience.
