Our guests included two former students who discussed their careers journeys and gender equality in industry. Merseyside Police and Civil Engineer Joanna Bateman supported the Careers Manager in delivering lessons to students in Year 7 and 8. Students even got to meet a dog handler and police dogs. The aim of the week was to instil in students the importance of thinking about their future choices and expose them to a wide variety of career sectors.



Emma Ikoku from university *UA92* delivered a talk to BTEC Sport 6th formers around Higher Education courses in Sport and routes into the sporting industry.
