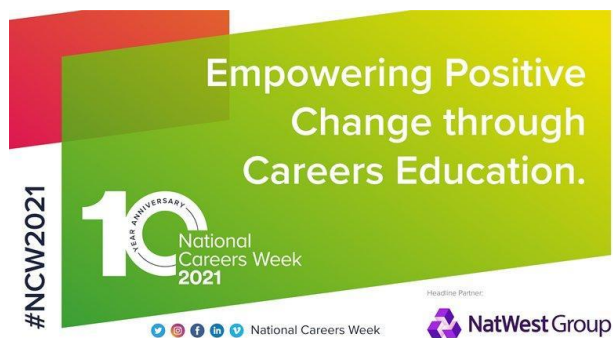

Careers Champion recognition

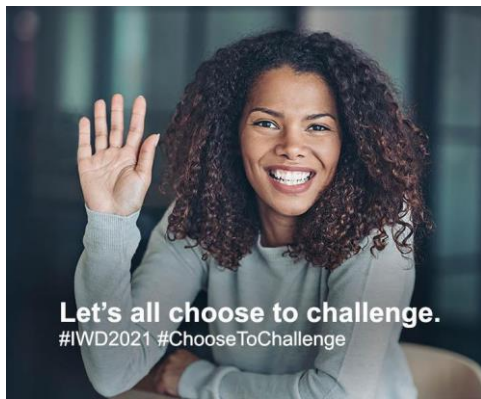
Feb 2021-May 2021, the story so far...

	<p>A cohort of Year 12 students attended a 'Pathways to the Legal Profession' virtual event delivered by the Liverpool Law Society where they got to hear about the different ways available to pursue a career in law. The event included speakers from local Universities, CILEx, providers of legal apprentices, a barrister and law firms who talked to students about the options regarding a career in the law.</p>
	<p>A cohort of 6th form students studying Childcare attended a virtual interactive workshop delivered by John Moores University School of Education, entitled 'Introduction to Childhood'. The aim of the event was to develop students understanding of childhood and discuss some of the contemporary issues that can affect children's lives and/or have an interest in pursuing an education-related course.</p>



Key Stage 3 received a PSHCE lesson dedicated to celebrating National Careers Week, with tasks to complete including exploring the language of careers, key qualities that employers look for and reflection tasks about their own skills and characteristics.



Key Stage 4 received a wealth of resources via Google Classroom including the 'Launch Yourself' booklet to encourage self reflection, local employer video links and presentations on how to write a CV and Labour Market Information.



International Women's Day was celebrated by students accessing a presentation explaining the importance of the day and which included videos from inspirational females in local businesses and snapshots of former female student success stories. It is imperative that our students feel empowered to achieve their full potential and challenge stereotypes or barriers to learning.



Edge Hill University delivered a virtual student finance talk to Year 13 students who have applied to university. The talk centred around money management, student loans and repayments. Careers Manager Miss Smith delivered a virtual talk to Year 13 students who have not applied to university. The talk centred around apprenticeships, applications forms, CV writing, Labour Market Information and the impact of COVID on the careers landscape.

	<p>Our Enterprise Coordinator nominated Weatherhead's Careers Manager Miss Smith, to be recognised by the Careers and Enterprise Company as a Careers Champion under the theme of 'innovating' for 'helping to inspire young people'. Maintaining high quality careers resources for students to access from home during COVID-19 has been a priority.</p>
	<p>Year 12 received a talk on 'Next Steps' which included information about the different routes available to them after 6th form. Higher Education, Higher and Degree level apprenticeships, T-Levels, School Leaver Programmes and employment options were all discussed, with further advice on Personal Statements and using Unifrog to conduct research.</p>
