

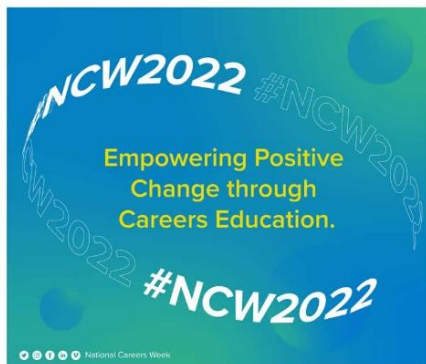

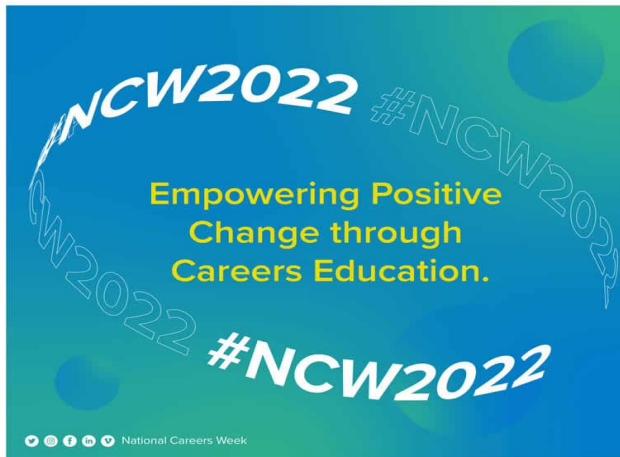

Please ensure students let their form tutors know if they require a careers appointment.



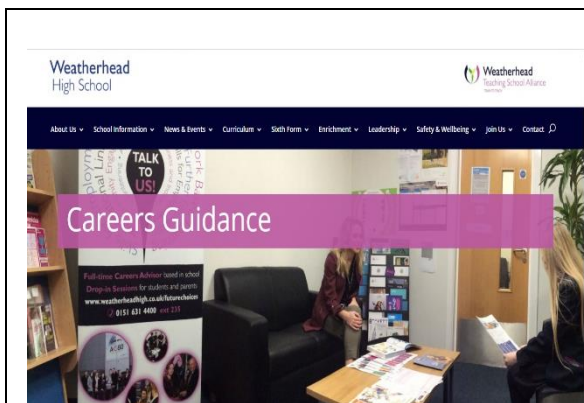
