## **British Science**Week

Science week this year took place from 13th -17th March. During the week, students enjoyed a wide range of exciting activities. Each year group attended an assembly presented by our STEM Co-Ordinator Mr Matthews-Wright which highlighted the benefits of studying STEM subjects and gave examples of how science links to different jobs. In lessons, students were introduced to a range of interesting careers in the NHS through Medical Mavericks - a company dedicated to inspiring the next generation of medics and Scientists. During the sessions, students were shown real life medical tests using specialist equipment, participated in their own medical experiments and had the opportunity to test out stethoscopes, reflex hammers & eye torches.

In February Mrs Perry, Head of Science, delivered an assembly to students as part of International Day of Women and Girls in Science. The assembly celebrated the contributions that women have made to Science as well as showcasing the successful journeys of former Weatherhead students into STEM careers. This was a highly inspiring assembly and raised awareness to students about equal access and participation in STEM subjects for women and girls.



# International Women's Day – A visit from Merseyside Police

International Women's day fell on Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> March this year which also formed part of Careers Week. What better way to celebrate these two important events, than to invite female officers from Merseyside Police to talk about, and promote, women in policing.

Superintendent Rachel Wilson and a team of 10 police officers joined Year 10 for their assembly to talk about their own career paths into the police and the importance of recruiting more female police officers into the force.



Following the assembly, groups of students visited Crime Scene Investigators where they had the opportunity to take fingerprints, dress up as crime scene investigators and compare footprints.

Students also heard from MATRIX Police officers and they got the chance to explore the specialist equipment used. We were also lucky enough to be joined by three police dogs and their handlers and students had the opportunity to see the dogs at work.

A big thank you to our Safer School's Police Officer Emma Hodgson for working closely with the policing teams to ensure this event was a success. The students (and staff) absolutely loved it!
