

Year 12 geographers visited New Brighton beach last week to carry out 'physical' Geography research and to study the effectiveness of coastal defences. The group identified coastal defences, conducted a beach profile and tourism surveys, and assessed coastal management effectiveness. In the afternoon, they moved to Victoria Road for their 'human' Geography research, focusing on urban regeneration. They surveyed the urban landscape, analysed use of space, explored retail and economic opportunities, and assessed the environment.

Aspiring doctors took part in the INTROMED (Introduction to Medicine) work experience programme at Arrowe Park Hospital. The group observed staged emergencies, wards, theatre, A&E and outpatient departments. The week provided clinical opportunities, along with a variety of teaching sessions and talks hosted by medical students and clinicians.











Year 12 students enjoyed a visit to *Dibbinsdale* Country Park to complete essential field work as part of their A Level Biology practical.

Nine Year 12 students attended a hands-on synthesis and spectroscopy workshop at the University of Liverpool last week. Students synthesized their own sample of the painkiller, Benzocaine, testing its purity using melting point analysis and calculating the percentage yield. In the afternoon, the group analysed the samples using infrared spectroscopy. They also carried out UV-vis spectroscopy on common food dyes to determine their components.

Year 12 students enjoyed a day at the University of Chester, including a campus tour and a criminology lecture. They learnt more about applying to university and the support available, and got to think about their futures.
