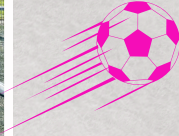

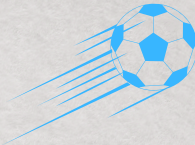

These statements represent the collective values and beliefs of the Weatherhead community. All members of our community should aspire to follow and model them.

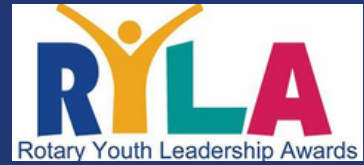
-  We work together to create a community built on mutual respect.
