


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Last Friday, artist Joe Venning visited Weatherhead to work with a group of Year 9 students on the School Nature Map, a Liverpool City Region project helping bring to life the new Local Nature Recovery Strategy. Schools in each of the six boroughs (Liverpool, Wirral, Sefton, Knowsley, St Helens and Halton) are involved in designing and producing a large scale map of their region, highlighting the areas of existing natural importance, areas that could be made important in the future, and keys species which need to be protected. The artworks will be displayed in a public exhibition in Mann Island Atrium in Spring 2025 and digital versions of the map and its individual elements will be included in the strategy itself. Students really enjoyed the day, spending time developing their painting and drawing skills.

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Mrs Ferry's Halloween Treats Easy, Peasy Pizza Witches' Fingers

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Simple to make but look really impressive, these pizza fingers can be made with any bread you may have at home.

INGREDIENTS:

2 slices of bread 1 tablespoon tomato puree/pizza sauce (any colour - to make the nails) 50g grated cheese

METHOD:

1. Trim the crusts off each slice of bread

(these could also be made using pitta bread or tortilla wraps) 2. Spread the tomato puree over the slice of bread ensuring it

doesn't go over the edge.

3. Sprinkle the cheese over the top, place on a baking tray and bake at 180c for 10 minutes or until the cheese has melted. You could add bits of chopped ham or sweetcorn to make your witches fingers look gruesome!

4. Prepare the pepper by cutting into thick slices, then into a

triangle shape by cutting at a 45-degree angle.

5. Once the pizzas are ready, remove from the tray and place on a chopping board. Cut the pizza into rectangular pieces.

6. Add a piece of pepper at the end of each piece, like the picture. You can use different coloured peppers if you want.

7. You could drizzle tomato ketchup over the nails to make your witches fingers look more gruesome.

8. Garnish as you wish.

Top tip - you could add green food colouring to the cheese or add cooked peas to make them look like a real witch's finger!









Mrs Ferry's Halloween Treats Pumpkin Rice Krispy Treats

These sweet and sticky treats are ideal for serving to the family or at a party. You will need an adult to help as melted

INGREDIENTS:

240g Rice Krispies 150g white mini marshmallows 75g unsalted butter orange food colouring

TO DECORATE:

Tubes of green and black icing pens Rolos or Matchmakers to make the stalk

- 1. Melt the butter and marshmallows in a heatproof bowl in a microwave - do this in 30 second intervals, keep stirring in 2. Add the orange food colouring and mix well.
- 3. Add the Rice Krispies into the bowl and carefully stir until all the Rice Krispies are coated. Leave to cook slightly before
- 4. Divide the Rice Krispies into 5 or 6 pieces, then mould and shape them all firstly into a ball then into a pumpkin shape. Be careful not to press too hard as you don't want to crush the Rice Krispies. If you want to get more from the mixture make each one smaller. 5. Leave to set for an hour.
- 6. To decorate your pumpkin use the black icing pen to draw funny faces. Use the green icing pen to make the leaves and you can use Rolos or a small piece of Matchmaker chocolates
